In my homily on the topic, I mentioned the young Italian who was blind. He attended church and received communion everyday for three years, praying that his sight would be restored.

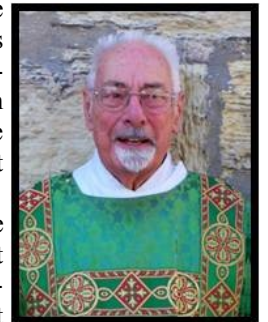

Wheat! Wheat! We Love Wheat!

Wheat is the sharing of our loving sacrifices in union with the Lord's Passion.

To do Wheat is to step into the flow of Christ's redemptive love and allow it to be channeled through us. It is a generous expression of our willingness to live the gift-love that is the heart of the Paschal Mystery.

Wheat can be done in a variety of ways for the good of the program. Some levels have a short term commitment, while others have a deeper longer term of dedication and service.

Are you interested in being on a Team or a Wheat Team? These levels of Wheat are of a different calling.

One involves more commitment than the other. I'd like to share some details and ask you to give some thought and prayer to filling out an application.

The leaders forming teams will not know to call unless you communicate your interest. Applications are available on our website at www.peterstowntec.com.

If you should submit an application, but not get called right away, don't lose heart. God's call will be at the right time. If you do get called, but circumstances won't allow you to commit to the upcoming dates, that doesn't mean you have lost out on the opportunity of ever being on a Team or Wheat Team. Applications are kept on file until you fulfill a position on either

type of team. If you would like to participate again, you'll need to complete a new updated application.

Teams begin formation six to eight weeks prior to the first team meeting. There are five team meetings to prepare for each TEC weekend, which are on Wednesday nights and last from about 6:30 to 9:30 pm.

It is very important that you clear your schedule to attend all of these meetings. The team arrives at the TEC Center on Friday night of the TEC weekend and stays through until 4 pm on Monday.

There are a variety of positions on a team. Meditations are given by all the adults, some young adults and some teens. Some meditations are required to be given by Catholics. An adult can be on a team without having had the candidate experience.

After serving on a team, you may be considered for the progression to assistant leader, and some day leader of a TEC weekend.

Wheat Teams begin formation weeks before the first Team Meeting. Participation is started through prayerful support of the Team attending weekly meetings.

The Wheat Team has only two meetings, also held on Wednesday nights, the two weeks prior to a TEC weekend. Members must attend both of these meetings, except in the case of college students where driving distance is great.

Wheat Teams are co-ed and consist of a leader, assistant

leader, spiritual leader, and up to six to seven Wheaties.

Co-ed consists of a balance in adult men and women combined with boy and girl teens. Our facility doesn't allow for the co-ed Wheat Teams to stay overnight; therefore, part of their Wheat is driving to and from the TEC Center each day.

Wheat Team members must commit to being at the TEC Center all



day on Saturday and Sunday of a TEC weekend. Friday night and Monday are optional, allowing flexibility for TECites to remain involved but not miss school or work.

A TECite can be on a Wheat Team before a regular Team and teens are encouraged to do so.

After serving as a Wheatie, you may be considered for the progression to assistant leader, and some day leader of a Wheat Team.

The TEC program needs your involvement to keep it strong! We need TECites to progress in their involvement and eventually commit to being leaders of Teams and Wheat Teams. Christ is Counting on You to Pass It On!!

On behalf of the entire TEC Community, we would like to welcome the newest TECites of TEC 171.

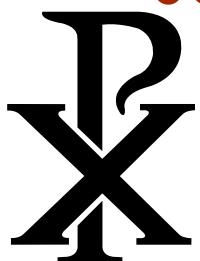
The weekend was held Nov. 6 -8, under the direction of Leader Phil Grant and Assistant Leaders Duane Krzyzek
