OLD TECITE - NEW PRIEST

My name is Father Jacob Rose, I was ordained May 25 of this year which means I've been ordained for just over three months. I am the parochial vicar at Saint Michael the Archangel in Streator and Saint Patrick's in Seneca as well as the chaplain of Marquette Academy in Ottawa. Looking back on just three months of life as a priest the thing that sticks out the most to me is how the Sacraments give life. I learned that while I was growing up and through my involvement in the TEC program, but I've encountered it in a real way during my short time as a priest. Also, its striking that it's not just one Sacrament that gives life but all of them. In the Sacrament of Reconciliation the sins of the penitent are wiped away and we're able to begin anew, with the same purity we received at our baptism. I've witnessed that when released from the burdens and bonds of sin, people are quick to have a different outlook on life and a new joy in their step. The Sacrament of Reconciliation is in fact freeing. I've also witnessed new life in the Sacrament of Marriage. While preparing young couples for the Sacrament of Marriage, there is a new excitement in life that is almost contagious. In particular though, I found the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick giving new life. In my short time as a priest, the Anointing of the Sick is part of my day at least three or four times per week. I've witnessed on several occasions visiting someone in the hospital or in their homes, and being warned that the person was "out of it" or "not responding to anything" or "can't recognize anything that is going on", but often after introducing myself as a priest there is a noticeable change. Two patients in particular grab my memory. The first was a routine home visit. I went to visit a parishioner who was on the homebound list, and the husband and daughter said, "Mom doesn't respond to much. She mostly just sits there all day". So, I told her who I was and that I was going to offer her the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick. And as I was anointing her, she lifted her dropping head and winked at me. She couldn't say anything else but it was a clear acknowledgment that she knew what was happening. The other was a patient in the hospital. Before entering the room, the nurse said the woman was greatly uncomfortable and very restless. I entered the room, and began to talk with the woman. The nurse was right; the woman wasn't comfortable at all, and very restless. A few minutes went by of our conversation, and I said that I would give her the Anointing of the Sick so I proceeded with the prayers of the Sacrament. In the middle of saying the prayers, there was an evident peace that had come over the woman — she had stopped twitching and jerking out of restlessness, and she laid there peacefully praying with me. When I left, there was a complete change in the woman and her attitude. It was certainly nothing I did, as it was one of the same hospital conversations I've had with 100 other patients. But in a profound and visible way, the Sacraments brought this woman new life and peace.

It's incredible to see the Sacraments giving new life to the people I am with, but it's not just the Sacraments but all of the Christian life. If we summarized the whole of the Old and the New Testaments, I think we'd find the summary in one verse: Revelation 21:5 which says, "Behold, I make all things new". When we let Christ into our lives, in every way but especially in the Sacraments, then there will be a newness in our lives that only God's grace can give. Please continue to pray for me because you need holy priests, and know of my prayers for you because I need holy people.

"I have come that they might have life, and have it to the fullest!" – John 10:10



It is that daily encounter with Christ that motivates, energizes, encourages, edifies, strengthens, and fills me with His peace, His life, and His love, as I hope it does and will continue to do for each one of you. May God abundantly bless you and may our Mother Mary wrap you in her mantle! I can't wait to meet many of you!


