It's a mystery to me how sometimes I can let a little thing ruin my whole day. I was with a group of friends having a pleasant conversation, and I was in a good mood and happy to be there. But then someone made a comment that I thought was hurtful. It probably was not meant to be taken that way, but I couldn't get it out of my mind. I was getting a little paranoid, and could feel those doors closing in my mind, as I subconsciously tried to protect myself by shutting everyone out. My mind kept going back to that moment in the conversation, as I wallowed in my negativity.

After a few days, with time and prayer, a healthier mental perspective returned. Those doors reopened and metanoia (that change of heart) replaced my paranoia.

Paranoia has us feeling that we always need to protect ourselves, that others will hurt us if we show any weakness, and that we need to show off our strength and talents to impress others. Paranoia quickly turns warmth into cold, understanding into suspicion and generosity into self-protection. But we can have a change of heart, a metanoia, and rise above that pettiness and have a spirit of forgiveness and love. The image comes to mind of the cross we received on our TEC weekend, with Christ on the cross with his arms outstretched, showing how much he loves us.

Some of the early church leaders suggested that all of us have two minds and two hearts. For them, each of us has a big mind and a big heart. That's the saint in us, the image and likeness of God inside us, the warm and loving part of us. All of us have that true greatness within. But we also have a petty mind and a petty heart. That's the self-centered part, the paranoid part that turns self-protective and immediately closes those doors of warmth and trust whenever we feel threatened. That's the battle within us. We are both big-hearted and petty, open-minded and bigoted, trusting and suspicious. Everything depends upon which heart and which mind we are using at any given moment.

Jesus invites us to that metanoia, that change of heart, to move toward and stay within our big minds and big hearts, so that in the face of a stinging remark our inner doors of warmth and trust do not close.
