All Saints' Day is coming up on November 1, and I'm reminded of our TEC weekend when we heard about various saints and selected our favorite saint. Perhaps it was the saint's name taken at our confirmation, or one whose life story touched us in some way. We might have selected a saint who was the patron saint of something of interest to us. Did you know that there is a patron saint of the TEC program? It's Saint Therese of Lisieux, the Little Flower, also known as St. Therese of the Child Jesus. Her feast day is October 1 which happened to be Monday of the TEC 210 weekend.

I went online to learn more about St. Therese of Lisieux and wanted to share some things I learned. Therese Martin was born in France in 1873. From an early age she decided to dedicate herself fully to God and at sixteen entered the Carmelite convent of Lisieux. On the directions of her superior, she began writing a diary of her childhood, which reflects simplicity and faith in the love and mercy of God. She fell ill in 1895 and died two years later at the age of only 24.

Therese's spirituality is simple and she calls it her "little way." She teaches us that God is everywhere - in every situation and person - and in the ordinary, simple details of life. Her "little way" teaches us to do the ordinary things of life with extraordinary love. A smile, a note of encouragement, a phone call, suffering in silence, always having a positive word, a simple unnoticed task to brighten the life of another, and so many other simple deeds, done with love - these are the examples of her spirituality (Sounds a lot like WHEAT, a sacrifice done prayerfully, doesn't it?) Therese teaches us that Jesus is everywhere and is the power for love and goodness operating within us.

Externally, there was nothing remarkable about this Carmelite nun. To many even in the convent, she seemed like such an average, ordinary person. Her "little way" seems to put holiness of life within the reach of ordinary people. Live out your days with confidence in God's love for you. Recognize that each day is a gift in which your life can make a difference by the way you choose to live it. (And **KEEP COMING BACK!**)

October is a month of many important feast days in our Church. A couple weeks ago on October 1st, we celebrated the feast day of St. Therese of Lisieux. On October 4th we celebrated the feast day of St. Francis of Assisi. October is also Respect Life month and one of the two months of the year the Catholic Church honors Mary, Our Lady of the Rosary. Here is a brief history of why we celebrate Our Lady of the Rosary.

October 7th is the feast of Our Lady of the Rosary. The Church chose that day and the month of October to honor Our Lady of the Rosary because a great victory took place on October 7. In October 1571, the Church in Europe faced a seemingly hopeless challenge. The Muslim Turks had already conquered the Middle East, slaughtering millions and forcing the survivors to convert to Islam. They then moved across the Mediterranean Sea, taking the crucial islands of Crete and Cyprus. From these islands, they set their sights on the Christian kingdoms of the central Mediterranean, threatening Sicily, Venice, and even Rome herself.

Pope Pius V called on the Christian princes of Europe to rally to defeat the Islamic threat. In addition, he called on rosary confraternities in Rome and all over Europe to undertake special processions and public recitation of the Rosary, asking the intercession of the Blessed Mother. What ensued was the famous Battle of Lepanto. The Christian fleet was far outnumbered and appeared to have no human hope of winning. On the first Sunday of October 1571, the Christian fleet met the invading Muslims off the coast of Greece in the Gulf of Lepanto. As Christians all over Europe prayed for Our Lady's intercession, the Turks surrounded the Christian ships. But the European fleet broke through. By days' end, almost all of the

Turks were driven to shore or drowned. Europe was saved. Pope Pius established an annual commemoration to honor Our Lady of Victory, and his successor, Gregory XIII, decreed that the first Sunday in October would be the feast of the Holy Rosary.

In summary, the decision to designate October as the month of the Rosary apparently stems from the Church's desire to extend its thanksgiving to Our Lady for victory in the Battle of Lepanto from one Sunday to a whole month. In addition, when Our Lady appeared in Fatima in May 1917, she identified herself as Our Lady of the Rosary.

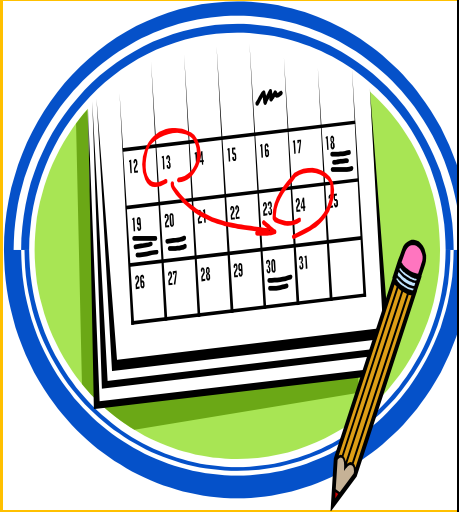
